

Winchcombe school Careers curriculum – weekly tutor time

- Each tutor group has an allocated once a week 25 minute time slot for a careers focus.
- The themes are related to the needs of each year group and vary in length.
- Sessions are planned by the Careers Lead and taught by tutors.
- Structure: primarily videos and guided discussion, although some year groups have also got various games/activities.
- Each year group also has one session directly linked to each school value.

Years 10 & 11 also have one week dedicated to revision techniques to support study and exams.

The purpose of these sessions is to maintain a dialogue across school about careers and to help tutors support student future plans.
